WALK IN RELATIONSHIP

Ephesians 5:21-6:9 Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ.

²² Wives, submit yourselves to your own husbands as you do to the Lord. ²³ For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. ²⁴ Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything.

²⁵ Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her ²⁶ to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, ²⁷ and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless. ²⁸ In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. ²⁹ After all, no one ever hated their own body, but they feed and care for their body, just as Christ does the church— ³⁰ for we are members of his body. ³¹ "For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh." ³² This is a profound mystery—but I am talking about Christ and the church. 33 However, each one of you also must love his wife as he loves himself, and the wife must respect her husband.

^{6:1} Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. ² "Honor your father and mother"—which is the first commandment with a promise— ³ "so that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth."

⁴ Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.

⁵ Slaves, obey your earthly masters with respect and fear, and with sincerity of heart, just as you would obey Christ. ⁶ Obey them not only to win their favor when their eye is on you, but as slaves of Christ, doing the will of God from your heart. ⁷ Serve wholeheartedly, as if you were serving the Lord, not people, ⁸ because you know that the Lord will reward each one for whatever good they do, whether they are slave or free.

⁹ And masters, treat your slaves in the same way. Do not threaten them, since you know that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and there is no favoritism with him. NIV

Luke 14:27 [Jesus said,] "And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple."

"Nothing has done greater damage to our Christian testimony than our trying to be right and demanding rights of others. We become preoccupied with what is right and what is not right. We ask ourselves, have we been justly or unjustly treated? and we think thus to vindicate our actions. But that is not our standard. The whole question for us is one of cross-bearing.

"You ask me, 'Is it right for someone to strike my cheek?' I reply, 'Of course not!' But the question is, do you only want to be right? As Christians our standard of living can never be 'right or wrong,' but the Cross. The principle of the Cross is our principle of conduct. Praise God that He makes His sun to shine on the evil and the good. With Him it is a question of his grace and not of right and wrong. But that is to be our standard also: 'Forgiving each other, even as God also in Christ forgave you' (Eph. 4:32) 'Right or wrong' is the principle of the Gentiles and tax-gathers. My life is to be governed by the principle of the Cross and of the perfection of the Father..." (Watchman Nee, SWS, p. 32)

Matthew 5:41 [Jesus said,] "If anyone forces you to go one mile, go with them two miles." NIV

"So, my brethren, don't stand on your right. Don't feel that because you have gone the second mile you have done what is just. The second mile is only typical of the third and the fourth. The principle is that of conformity to Christ." (Watchman Nee, SWS, p. 33)

"More and more things will turn up to hurt our Christian sense of righteousness and to test what our reactions are going to be. We need to learn the principle of the cross—that our standard is not now the old, but the new man, 'that after God hath been created in righteousness and holiness of truth' (Eph. 4:24). 'Lord, I've got no rights to defend. Everything I have is through Thy grace, and everything is in Thee!'" (Watchman Nee, SWS, p. 42)

"Too many Christians have all the doctrine, but live lives that are a contradiction of it. They know all about chapters 1-3 of Ephesians, but they do not put chapters 4-6 into practice. It [is] better to have no doctrine than to be a contradiction. Has God commanded something? Then throw yourself back on God for the means to do what he has commanded. May the Lord teach us that the whole principle of the Christian life is that we go beyond what is right to do that which is well-pleasing to Him." (Watchman Nee, SWS, p. 42)
