Suffering Verses for Further Study (New English Translation):

Psalms 30:5b One may experience <u>sorrow</u> during the night, but joy arrives in the morning.

Psalms 34:18-19 The Lord is near the <u>broken-hearted</u>; he delivers those who are <u>discouraged</u>. ¹⁹The godly face many <u>dangers</u>, but the Lord saves them from each one of them.

Psalms 119:50 This is what comforts me in my trouble, for your promise revives me.

- **1 Corinthians 7:29-31** And I say this, brothers and sisters: The time is short. So then those who have wives should be as those who have none, ³⁰those with <u>tears</u> like those not <u>weeping</u>...
- **2 Corinthians 1:3-7** Blessed is...God...who comforts us in all our <u>troubles</u> so that we may be able to comfort those experiencing any <u>trouble</u> with the

comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God. ⁵For just as the <u>sufferings</u> of Christ overflow toward us, so also our comfort through Christ overflows to you. ⁶But if we are <u>afflicted</u>, it is for your comfort and salvation; if we are comforted, it is for your comfort that you experience in your patient endurance of the same sufferings that we also <u>suffer</u>. ⁷And our hope for you is steadfast because we know that as you share in our sufferings, so also you will share in our comfort.

2 Corinthians 4:17 For our momentary, light suffering is producing for us an eternal weight of glory far beyond all comparison

Philippians 1:29 For it has been granted to you not only to believe in Christ but also to suffer for him.

Philippians 3:10-11 My aim is to know him, to experience the power of his resurrection, to share in his sufferings, and to be like him in his death...

- **1 Thessalonians 1:6** And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, when you received the message with joy...despite great <u>affliction</u>.
- **1 Thessalonians 3:2-3** We sent Timothy...to strengthen you and encourage you about your faith, ³so that no one would be shaken by these <u>afflictions</u>. For you yourselves know that we are destined for this.
- **2 Thessalonians 1:4** As a result we ourselves boast...for your perseverance and faith in all the persecutions and <u>afflictions</u> you are enduring.
- **2 Timothy 1:8** So do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord or of me, a prisoner for his sake, but by God's power accept your share of suffering for the gospel.
- **2 Timothy 1:12** Because of this, in fact, I <u>suffer</u> as I do. But I am not ashamed, because I know the one in whom my faith is set and I am convinced that he is able to protect what has been entrusted to me until that day.
- **2 Timothy 2:8-9** Remember Jesus Christ...such is my gospel, ⁹ for which I <u>suffer</u> hardship to the point of imprisonment as a criminal, but God's message is not imprisoned!

2 Timothy 3:10-11 You, however, have followed my teaching, my way of life, my purpose, my faith, my patience, my love, my endurance, ¹¹ as well as the <u>persecutions</u> and <u>sufferings</u> that happened to me in Antioch, in Iconium, and in Lystra.

Hebrews 2:18 For since he himself <u>suffered</u> when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are tempted.

Hebrews 10:32-39 But remember the former days when you endured a harsh conflict of <u>suffering</u> after you were enlightened. ³³At times you were publicly exposed to <u>abuse</u> and <u>afflictions</u>, and at other times you came to share with others who were treated in that way. ³⁴For in fact you shared the <u>sufferings</u> of those in prison, and you accepted the confiscation of your belongings with joy, because you knew that you certainly had a better and lasting possession. ³⁵So do not throw away your confidence, because it has great reward. ³⁶For you need endurance in order to do God's will and so receive what is promised...

James 1:2-4 My brothers and sisters, consider it nothing but joy when you fall into all sorts of <u>trials</u>, ³because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance. ⁴And let endurance have its perfect effect, so that you will be perfect and complete, not deficient in anything.

James 1:12 Happy is the one who endures <u>testing</u>, because when he has proven to be genuine, he will receive the crown of life that God promised to those who love him.

James 5:10-11 As an example of <u>suffering</u> and patience, brothers and sisters, take the prophets who spoke in the Lord's name. ¹¹Think of how we regard as blessed those who have endured. You have heard of Job's endurance and you have seen the Lord's purpose, that the Lord is full of compassion and mercy.

1 Peter 1:6-7 This brings you great joy, although you may have to <u>suffer</u> for a short time in various <u>trials</u>. ⁷Such <u>trials</u> show the proven character of your faith, which is much more valuable than gold—gold that is tested by fire, even though it is passing away—and will bring praise and glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed.

- **1 Peter 2:19-21** For this finds God's favor, if because of conscience toward God someone endures <u>hardships</u> in <u>suffering</u> unjustly. ²⁰For what credit is it if you sin and are mistreated and endure it? But if you do good and suffer and so endure, this finds favor with God. ²¹For to this you were called, since Christ also <u>suffered</u> for you, leaving an example for you to follow in his steps.
- **1 Peter 3:14** But in fact, if you happen to <u>suffer</u> for doing what is right, you are blessed...
- **1 Peter 3:17** For it is better to <u>suffer</u> for doing good, if God wills it, than for doing evil.
- **1 Peter 4:1** So, since Christ <u>suffered</u> in the flesh, you also arm yourselves with the same attitude, because the one who has <u>suffered</u> in the flesh has finished with sin,
- 1 Peter 4:12-19 Dear friends, do not be astonished that a trial by fire is occurring among you, as though something strange were happening to you. ¹³But rejoice in the degree that you have shared in the sufferings of Christ, so that when his glory is revealed you may also rejoice and be glad. ¹⁴If you are insulted for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the Spirit of glory, who is the Spirit of God, rests on you. ¹⁵But let none of you suffer as a murderer or thief or criminal or as a troublemaker. ¹⁶But if you suffer as a Christian, do not be ashamed, but glorify God that you bear such a name. ¹⁷For it is time for judgment to begin, starting with the house of God. And if it starts with us, what will be the fate of those who are disobedient to the gospel of God? ¹⁸And if the righteous are barely saved, what will become of the ungodly and sinners? ¹⁹So then let those who suffer according to the will of God entrust their souls to a faithful Creator as they do good.
- **1 Peter 5:10** And, after you have <u>suffered</u> for a little while, the God of all grace who called you to his eternal glory in Christ will himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you.
- **2 Peter 2:9** ...the Lord knows how to rescue the godly from their <u>trials</u>, and to reserve the unrighteous for punishment at the day of judgment.

Discussion Questions

Icebreaker option 1: Tell about a scar that you have and how you got it.

Icebreaker option 2: Tell about a time when life got so hard you questioned God.

- 1) Since we believe in an all-powerful and loving God, it is natural to want to know why God allows us to suffer. Think of some of the hardest trials of your life. Do you think it is possible to believe in God's goodness without knowing the answers as to why He allowed those trials in your life? If it is possible, explain how. If it is not possible, then how can we find peace when we can't find those answers?
- 2) It is far easier to believe that God loves us and is compassionate toward us when we are not currently suffering (or in other words, when we've been delivered from our past trials). So our perceptions about how God feels about us waver based on our trials. Does God's love and compassion actually waver?
- 3) How does understanding that suffering is a normal and expected part of life take the edge off of the pain of suffering? Or does it?
- 4) When we think about the next ten years of our lives, we can expect to go through some hard times. Yet when new trials come they always seem so shocking. Why is that? How can we have hope when we live in a broken and fallen world that continues to bring sickness, death, and sin into our lives?
- 5) How can we cling to God when overwhelmed with various trials? How can we draw near to God in those times when we feel hurt by Him?
- 6) What has encouraged you and given you hope and comfort in tough times?
- 7) Is there anything you would like to do now, that might help you prepare for trials ahead?
