Teaching others what is good

Titus 2:3 Likewise, teach the older women to be reverent in the way they live, not to be slanderers or addicted to much wine, <u>but to teach what is good</u>. NIV

Being busy at home/ keepers at home

Titus 2:4-5 Then they can urge the younger women to love their husbands and children, to be self-controlled and pure, to be busy at home, to be kind, and to be subject to their husbands, so that no one will malign the word of God. NIV

1 Timothy 5:16 If any woman who is a believer has widows in her family, she should help them and not let the church be burdened with them, so that the church can help those widows who are really in need.

GOOD DEEDS DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What is something you learned or that stood out to you from this teaching?
2. What is a practical take-away that you want to apply to your own life?
3. How does being a woman of good deeds make you a "pillar and buttress of the truth" and prevent the maligning of the Word of God?
4. What is your perspective on the good work of bringing up children? When you are overwhelmed and discouraged about all of the work that bringing up children requires, what truth can you daily hold onto and believe that will help you see this good deed as of great value in the Lord's eyes?
5. How has the hospitality of others influenced your walk with the Lord? What hinders you in practicing hospitality on a regular basis? How can you grow in being hospitable?
6. What are some ways you and the women in your church are "washing the feet of the saints"? How do you cultivate a yielded heart to your husband's leadership in the amount and type of washing you are able to do?
7. Tell a story of a time the church "helped you in trouble." What impact did that have on your life and faith? What practical things have you found meaningful to women as you've helped them in their trouble?
8. How have other women stirred you up to love and good deeds? What can you do to stir up your sisters to love and good deeds?
